REGULAR MEETING

May 11, 2026

CALL TO ORDER

The May 11, 2026 regular meeting of the Corydon Township Supervisors was called to order at 6:00 pm by Dennis Faucher, Supervisor Chairman. The Pledge of Allegiance Followed.

PRESENT

Dennis Faucher, Raymond Douglass, Michael Yohe, Supervisors; Lisa Godding, Secretary/Treasurer; Public: Dave and Stacey Skaggs, Pam Salade, Brenden Fox

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Raymond Douglass made the motion to adopt April 13, 2026 minutes. Michael Yohe seconded, all were in favor.

NEW BUSINESS

- Spring Clean Up 2026 – It was decided after discussion to have the Spring Clean Up on Saturday only. Money collected: \$330 so far.
- Well Permits – Dennis Faucher reviewed the paperwork from Hampson Surveying.
- Complaint Worksheet – Dennis Faucher read the April 23, 2026 complaint from local residents regarding neighboring dogs running loose for over two years and being on their property – showing up 1-2 times a week, causing their security system to engage. They have invested over \$11,000 in fencing for their own dogs. They are also concerned about the condition of the dogs. They are “starving.” The PA Dog Warden, Amy Tyger has been notified, along with the PA State Police. Ms. Tyger confronted the owner of the dogs and informed her to get the dogs attended to by May 15th. Ms. Tyger also had a conversation with the State Police.

OLD BUSINESS

- Cornplanter Cemetery Road Repair – Lanny Layton will be contacted to see if he has contact information.
- McKean County Maintenance Culvert Project – This starts in 2027. There are quite a few concerns: ambulance service, temporary road, fire service. A Task Force will be created for this project.

ROAD DEPARTMENT REPORT

Dennis Faucher presented the April Road Report:

- Took plows off of the F550 and Mack
- Took Mack to MAC Welding to get repairs on the dump body.
- Plowed Roads
- Cleaned shop

SECRETARY/TREASURER REPORT

The Secretary/Treasurer report was presented.

APPROVAL TO PAY EXPENSES

A motion was made by Raymond Douglass to pay expenses, and a second by Michael Yohe. All were in favor.

CITIZENS CONCERNS

The on-going Burning Complaint: The Supervisors will ask Stan Pecora to draft a letter. Also, a letter for the dogs disturbing the peace.
