REGULAR MEETING

May 6, 2024

CALL TO ORDER

The May 6, 2024 regular meeting of the Corydon Township Supervisors was called to order at 6:00 pm by Dennis Faucher, Chairman.

PRESENT

Dennis Faucher, Raymond Douglass, Michael Yohe, Supervisors; Stan Pecora, Solicitor; Public: Erik Olsson, Jan and Charlie Kaefer

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Raymond Douglass made the motion to adopt the April 8, 2024 minutes. Michael Yohe seconded, all were in favor.

NEW BUSINESS

- Supervisors approved to renew the CD at Edward Jones. Michael Yohe made a motion to accept the CD and Raymond Douglass seconded; all were in favor.

OLD BUSINESS

- Supervisors discussed the cancellation of a current Liability Insurance coverage for a road bond. Supervisors were not sure who the coverage was for.
- Discussed the purchase of a sweeper for road maintenance – stated check will need to be signed.
- Received a letter from resident, Marty Wilder, in regard to upcoming Spring Clean-up. She stated that some residents residing in the Marshurg area do not have the means to dispose of material(s) at the Township Municipal building. Supervisors discussed possibility of putting a dumpster in that area next year.
- Discussed Verizon and Starlink hook-up. Michael Yohe will contact Township Secretary to follow through with the Starlink hook-up.
- Dennis Faucher stated that the Liquid Fuels Audit went well.
- Per Dan Peterson's previous request of changing portion of Quinn Road back to Myra Lane, the Supervisors agreed. Mr. Peterson has street sign; so that Township will not need to purchase a "Myra Lane" street sign.

ROAD DEPARTMENT REPORT

Dennis Faucher presented the April Road Report:

- Dave Morris and Bradford Forest Products signed an agreement to repair Stickney Trail back to its prior condition.
- Picked up sickle parts at LandPro.
- Got bids on paving work to be done on Stickney Trail.
- Cleaned ditched on Wolf Run Road.
- Removed plows and sander from trucks.
- Mowed grass around Township Building.

SECRETARY/TREASURER REPORT

The Secretary/Treasurer report was presented.

APPROVAL TO PAY EXPENSES

A motion was made by Raymond Douglass to pay expenses, and a second by Michael Yohe. All were in favor.

CITIZENS CONCERNS

Erik Olsson, representing Bradford Forest Products, stated him and Dave Morris reviewed films from 2022 and 2023. They both agreed that repaving would not be necessary. He stated that “mill and fill” the potholes on Stickney Trail would solve the problem and the expense would be a lot less expensive than repaving. Supervisors have already received previous bids on this project and are waiting for grant monies that would assist in this project. Also, Shawn Agosti from PennDOT will be on-site to review and advise the damage to Stickney Trail. Supervisors will keep Mr. Olsson informed of progress.

ADJOURNMENT

A motion was made by Michael Yohe, seconded by Raymond Douglass to adjourn the meeting. All were in favor. Meeting adjourned at 6:25 p.m.
